Notes from the SIOC Rehearsal Room

Being part of SIOC's Spring Harmony show gave me my first ever chance performing in a Carnatic concert. It was a lovely and fulfilling experience. I was initially nervous at the idea of singing ragamalika or RTP or thillana on a big stage. That's where the rehearsal sessions helped build my confidence. Our instructors Smt Lalitha, Smt Vicknesvari and Smt Bharati taught us every composition with great passion, ensuring that we captured its essence and presented it with appropriate "bhaavam". The rehearsals also allowed to interact with other me instrumentalists and learn from them about their own musical journey. In a way, the rehearsals helped me overcome a lot of illusionary barriers to learning and performing Carnatic music.

With so much preparation, the actual concert was a very pleasant and a memorable experience. I am grateful for SIOC for this opportunity.

I recently had the honour of participating in SIOC's Spring Harmony concert, in the Veena section. It was both, a challenging and rewarding experience. The training sessions were rigorous, but with the clear guidance and support of Lalitha ma'am, Vicknesvari ma'am, and Bharati ma'am, I felt motivated to practice even harder. As the concert date approached, rehearsals became even more intensive to build our stamina.

Among the diverse repertoire of 8 compositions, 'Dasavatharam' posed a particular challenge for me, requiring precise timing and coordination within the Veena section. With multiple *talas* and *layas* to navigate, staying attuned to our conductor, Vicknesvari ma'am, was essential. Practicing with the entire orchestra taught me a valuable lesson: focus is everything. Each section had its own unique notes, making it crucial not to get distracted.

Looking back, the training sessions have deepened my understanding of Veena and Carnatic music. I am grateful for the opportunity to be a part of SIOC, and eagerly anticipate more enriching experiences in the future.

The SIYOC opened the new year on a melodious note with their new digital production, <u>Swaranjali</u>, which premiered on our YouTube channel in Jan 2024. An exhilarating composition by noted musician OS Arun, Swaranjali is a confluence of rising and falling notes that seamlessly flow through 7 different ragams. The young musicians deftly navigate the intricate note patterns and pay tribute to the magic of classical Indian music.

SIYOC released another digital production, <u>Reflections</u>, based on a 2-ragam piece composed by the legendary Dr L Subramaniam specially for SIOC. Experience the illusion of reflections, created by harmonic changes played by the keyboards and a 3-part canon for ethnic infusion.

A composition evocative of the sublime joys of life - such as a steaming cup of coffee during the seasonal rains - the Kapi Espresso! is our new digital production that serves up a rich Indian classical flavour.

Just in time for the Indian new year celebrations in April, comes our latest digital gem, <u>Grirala Sudha</u>, a traditional Thyagaraja Krithi invoking Lord Ganesha, which has been cleverly adorned with a western touch in the form of background music played by the Orchestra.

Member in the Spotlight: Sri Santhakumar

An outstanding musician in clarinet and saxophone, Sri Santhakumar joined SIOC in 1985 and has illustriously served for almost 40 years.

Born in Singapore in 1950, Santhakumar was self-taught in clarinet. He learnt saxophone under Yamaha Music School and received a Grade 3 certificate. He also spent some time learning Carnatic music from the Nadaswaram artiste of Sri Sivan Temple.



Using SIOC as a training ground, he excelled in both instruments. The only musician performing on 'blowing' instruments in SIOC, Santhakumar performed in several overseas SIOC shows, travelling to Malaysia, India, Japan, Hong Kong and more. It is noteworthy that, ultimately, it was his personal effort and determination that shaped him into a top-level musician.

Santhakumar continues to perform in Singapore Broadcasting Corporation's Indian section over radio and television. Even now, at age 73, this family man's adept time management enables him to serve as a grassroots leader in Paya Lebar CC, in addition to his job at ICA and his musical activities. This earned him the Singapore government's prestigious PBS award in 2014, for his contributions to Singapore. SIOC is proud of Santhakumar's skills, success and service.


